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The Rosary: More Powerful Than the Atomic Bomb

On August 6, 1945, an atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima, Japan. Over 140,000 were killed, and many were left wounded. Eight blocks from the hypocenter, Jesuit missionaries walked away from the devastation unharmed and never would have any effects from the radiation. The Jesuit missionaries prayed the Rosary everyday.

"We believe that we survived because we were living the message of Fatima."

The night of August 6, 2014, many were forced to abandon their Christian cities in the Nineveh Plain. There are over 300,000 Iraqi refugees because of the persecution. There were 25,000 Christians in Mosul before the arrival of the Islamic State. Now, there are none. Christians are being persecuted. They are being pushed out of their towns and homes. They are being tortured and killed for their faith.

What would happen if we joined together to pray the Rosary for them?

Pray, whether in the morning, in the evening or at night; alone, with friends, or with family; at school, at work, in the subway, or in the car; in the hospital, at church, or in your home. If we pray the Rosary we will be able to spiritually support the persecuted Christians and help strengthen them in their sufferings through the power of prayer.

How to pray the Rosary

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.

2. Holding the Crucifix, say the Apostles' Creed.

3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.

4. Say three Hail Marys on each of the next three beads.

5. Say the Glory Be

6. For each of the five decades, announce the

Mystery then say the Our Father.

7. While moving each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating

on the Mystery.

Then say a Glory Be.

(After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.)

8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen.



Glorious Mysteries Meditations for the Persecuted Christians

1. The Resurrection of Jesus (Mat 28,1-6)

Christ, by your Resurrection, you show us your power over sin and death. Eternal life is worth any sacrifice and cross we must bare in this life. Let us take confidence in your promise of eternal life and suffer what we must to stay true to you.

"The prize is so great. It is an entire eternity that is truly worth it. Any sacrifice that I might have to make here is worth it, any renouncement. 2. The Ascension of Jesus into Heaven (Luk 24,36-51)

Your Ascension into heaven reminds us that you are waiting for us there. Help us to never take our eyes off of heaven, and grant us an ever-growing desire to be there with You.

"They see it as a grace because the situation they are in makes them live with their eyes fixed on Heaven. Their eyes are fixed on Heaven, and no one takes their gaze from there. They say, "They can take whatever they want, they can kill me and cut my head off, but they can't take Heaven away from me. They can't." And this is their strength. And this strength is manifested even in front of their persecutors."- Sr. Maria of Guadalupe Rodrigo, SSVM.

3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit (Act 2,1-4)

Jesus, send the Holy Spirit and strengthen those who face dangers and even death for following you. Send forth your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.

"I think that the Syrian Christians are very brave, and the Iraqi Christians also. And they aren't brave because that's how they are – I think the Holy Spirit supports us and accompanies us in everything, because if not, you couldn't continue forward. 4. The Assumption of Mary into Heaven (Jdt 13,18-20; 15,10) Mary, you were assumed into heaven. We know that you pray and care for us and continue to make your maternal presence known. With you, all fear vanishes.

5. Coronation of Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth (Rev 12,1)

Mary, we call to you as our Queen and Mother. Pray for us, help us in all our needs. We know that you never abandon those who turn to you with trust.
